

Do you dream of working as a nurse in Finland? Are you an ambitious foreign-trained nurse with a Bachelor's degree?

The application period is 2-5.3.2020.

### **General facts:**

- Only graduates who have a professional degree and have been registered as professional practitioners are authorised to work as registered nurses in Finland.
- Upon graduation, students will receive the title of: Bachelor of Health Care (Registered Nurse) and can apply for the right to work as a professional practitioner from Valvira, the National Supervisory Authority for Welfare and Health.

# Eligibility to apply:

- The programme is taught in English, but language skills in Finnish or Swedish are necessary to complete the practical training periods.
- Applicants should include either a Civil Service Language Proficiency Certificate (satisfactory language skills) or a National Certificate of Language Proficiency (skill level 3 throughout) in their application. Applicants who do not have a language certificate can also prove their language skills by participating in an interview at Arcada.

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## Structure of the programme:
